"South Park" Franchise a Crux at the Adult Cartoons Panel

The "From Fritz the Cat to Rick and Morty: Adult Cartoons" panel often returned to "South Park" for its pertinence to

the sub-topic of the minute.

"South Park" was cited for normalizing a cultural tone deemed unacceptable to an earlier generation, but did "The Simpsons" do it already (the SP episode "The Simpsons' Did It" suggests the Fox show did *everything* before SP thought to touch it)? Or was it the live-action "The Honeymooners" (from which the first primetime cartoon "The Flintstones" was derived)?



When is it a good idea to allow children to watch

"South Park"? "It was an awkward moment: I was a 'South Park' fan and then I had a kid", said panelist Derek McCaw, editor/host of Fanboy Planet website/podcast.

McCaw cited Roger Ebert's review of "South Park: Bigger, Longer, and Uncut" that said the 1999 movie (in which self-parody enables satire of parental reaction to the movie-within-the-movie that's based on the show-within-the-show) was the best anti-censorship movie in decades, while his son wasn't allowed to play the SP "Sticks of Truth" game until he was a teenager.
